- 63 clubs from across the US met in New York City and officially formed the General Federation of Women's Clubs under the leadership of Jane Cunningham Croly. The GFWC constitution was ratified.
- Today there are approximately 3,200 clubs and 80,000 members worldwide.
- Every year, Federation Day gives us the opportunity to reflect on where we have been as an organization and to look forward to the goals we hope to accomplish in the future.
- As Clubwomen we wear many hats. So, put those hats on display and share your great work in your community on Federation Day.
- GFWC unites us all to one common mission to celebrate Unity in Diversity.








Federation Day Ideas
